Ground Transportation Options

White House

Home of every US president except George Washington, the White House overlooks the National Mall.

US Capitol, Capitol Hill

Daily 9:00 AM – 4:30 PM; 202-225-6827

Under the magnificent white dome, senators and representatives meet to make laws and shape U.S. policy. Free tours leave from the Rotunda every 15 minutes and include the original Supreme Court Chamber, Statuary Hall, and the Crypt, which was the intended burial place for George and Martha Washington and now presents historical exhibits.

Washington Monument

Daily: 9 AM – 5 PM

The world's largest masonry structure, this obelisk was dedicated in 1885 to the memory of the first US President. A major renovation was completed in 1999.

Lincoln Memorial

Engraved above President Lincoln is the most apt description of the memorial, "In this Temple, as in the hearts of the people, for whom he saved the Union, the memory of Abraham Lincoln is enshrined forever". President Lincoln is remembered for his struggle to preserve the United States as one nation during its 1861-1865 Civil War.

Jefferson Memorial

This simple circular classical white marble monument is one of the city's most picturesque landmarks. The architecture is in keeping with a style favored by the third US President, an architect, scholar and political thinker.

FDR Memorial

This outdoor park-like memorial traces 12 years of American History through a series of four outdoor rooms with a waterfall in each. Each room is devoted to one term of Franklin Delano Roosevelt's four-term presidency.

Vietnam Veterans Memorial: "The Wall"

Designed by Maya Ying Lin, this simple monument honors the personal sacrifices of 58,209 Americans missing or killed in one of America's least popular wars.

National Air and Space Museum

This is the most popular museum in the world. Where else can you walk among space craft such as the Apollo 11 Lunar Module, look up at the Wright Brothers' 1903 Flyer, and find hot-air balloons and all kinds of rockets. Many people like to look inside the space modules and imagine what it felt like to be alone in space in such a tiny capsule. Others enjoy the exhibits on the galaxies, the planets and popular space culture like the TV series *Star Trek*. Kids like to try freeze-dried space ice-cream and can purchase kites suitable for flying on the mall. View state-of-the-art IMAX films and learn about the technology that enables us to fly.

National Museum of Natural History

Step into exhibits of life-sized animals of the past and the present. View the largest stuffed African Bush Elephant, dinosaur fossils, ocean life, insect life and the amazing 45-carat Hope Diamond and other treasures of the gem world.

National Museum of African Art

A beautiful and modern museum devoted to the collection and study of African art from the past and present. Understand why African art is such a dynamic part of American Culture.

National Museum of American History

Go back in time and find all that is Americana as you tour a collection that commemorates American scientific, technological, and cultural history. Items on display range from early locomotives and automobiles, to sound recordings of early American musicians, to medical and biotechnological instrumentation. Walk around the flag that inspired *The Star-Spangled Banner* and view Dorothy's famous red slippers from *The Wizard of Oz*.

National Museum of American Art

This museum features paintings, sculpture, folk art, photography and graphics by American artists from the 18th century to the present.

National Gallery of Art & the East Wing

One of the finest art collections in the world, illustrating major achievements in painting, sculpture and graphic arts from the Middle Ages to the present.

United States Holocaust Memorial Museum

This somber and moving museum tells the story of the Holocaust in a very personal way. Listen to oral histories, watch films, and view scale models, photographs and possessions of the many people who passed through this part of history.

Corcoran Gallery of Art

The Corcoran is the largest non-federal museum in Washington. Primarily represented are the American visual arts, dating from the colonial period to the present. It also features Dutch and Flemish masterpieces from the 1600's, as well as French impressionists and post-impressionists.

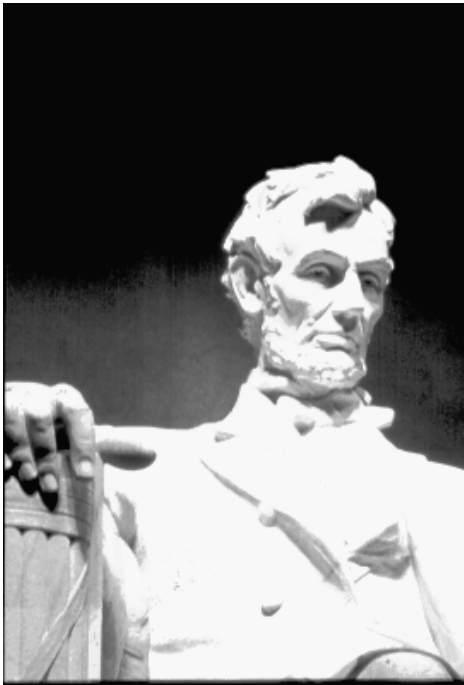
